


Organisation of training

- Creation of an in-house training centre + outsourcing
- Teachers = experienced in-house personnel, course leaders from external training centres, police officers, psychologists, etc.
- Integrated management of training + ministerial authorisation + legal mandates



Training path





Training required by law

- The Ministry of the Interior approves the training centres, the content of the courses and the teachers
- Regulations set out the minimum compulsory programme for management and operational staff
- The principle: a common core for all security guards, plus supplementary modules for each speciality
- Examined by the training centres + via the public body Selor
- Programme for Securail:
 - Basic training for security guards (132 hours)
 - Supplementary training for security agents (36 hours)



Base module

- Organisation of the sector
- Regulations applying to the security sector
- Rights and obligations of security staff
- Communication techniques
- Analogue and digital communication methods
- Cultural awareness and contact with diversity
- Observation and reporting
- Psychological approach to conflicts
- Physical avoidance techniques
- Appropriate reactions in case of fire, bomb threats and disasters
- Industrial first aid (+ AED)
- Social relations within the sector



Supplementary module: public transport security agents

- Obligations, skills and procedures
- Recognising dangerous situations in a public transport environment and approach techniques to prevent violent situations
- Techniques for the use of handcuffs and sprays
- Techniques for detention and security checks

- Safety at work






























Local training – Example 1 – Training on homelessness (*HoPe in Station*)

- Instructions and training base on real experiences




Local training – Example 2 – Public transport as a terrorist target

 - 2) Training software










Local training – Example 3 – Languages

Refresher training required by law

- Condition for the renewal of agents' ministerial authorisations
- 16 hours every 5 years
- By a recognised external training centre
- Theory + use of security techniques, handcuffs and sprays

- Theoretical training for railway police departments
- Co-organisation of training for canine officers working for Securail, the federal railway police, and the Brussels urban transport company
